

“Pacific Coast SS Co. GIPSY ran on rocks at McAbees bathing beach.
The night was clear, wind fresh N.W. with heavy seas.
Capt. Boyd, formerly mate of the GIPSY, had been one week in command.
Approaching Monterey from Moss Landing,
The light at McAbees was mistaken for the Monterey wharf light.
Vessel and cargo total loss.”

September 27, 1905

GIPSY broke up at 6:30 pm, much remaining on the rocks.”

September 28, 1905

“Hull of GIPSY sold at public auction at noon for \$25.
Upper works on beach brought \$11.”

September 29, 1905, Emily Fish, keeper

“A coyote near the station yelped at sunset. Thunder and lightening.”
