1. Replace the plan for a Monterey Cypress hedge (because of high maintenance required) with the planting of Monterey Cypress every 20' around the oval where needed. (#5)
2. Place a 12' border of wood chips around the inside of the oval under the Cypress trees. (A)
3. Reaffirm that the planted bed around the restored fountain is about 30' **I thought it was closer to 40'** as shown on the original plan. (#C and #D)
4. Reaffirm that the DG (decomposed granite) around the flagpole and picnic areas are kept and expanded to include all areas north of lighthouse building to the wood chip area under the Cypress trees inside the oval fence, roughly 32' x 56'. (#B and #M)
5. ~~Create a 4' wide decomposed granite path north of the gift shop from the area described in # 4 above to the ADA sidewalk.~~
6. Reaffirm the planted area of about 30' x 24' east of the lighthouse building. Eliminate the deer fencing for aesthetic and event interference reasons and use only deer proof plants. (#11 and #E)
7. Around the historic building a 3' to 5' area will be left unplanted and unwatered. Rather than large pots of succulents there will be weed cloth and wood chips. (#16, #G and #F). **I still think that succulents in clay pots will look better than just wood chips. And the succulents will not need water once established and so will not cause a problem for the lighthouse foundation. Maybe this decision can be delayed until later?**
8. Affirm the planted bed on the south side of the ADA walk near the gift shop but enlarge it to adjoin the decomposed area. (#D)
9. Placement, number and design of memorial benches are not addressed in this document.
10. The absence of a palm tree is reaffirmed.

Monterey Cypress, *Cupressus macrocarpa* is an evergreen tree to 50', can be clipped as an 8 ft. hedge, and best within sight of the coast (west or east). *C. macrocarpa* is native to the point at the south end of Monterey Bay, is susceptible to canker when grown with drip irrigation, and is valued best as a coastal windbreak. This tree has survived ok in the interior in sandy soil with little or no water. It loves to be washed off once a week.

This rare plant, with green foliage, and gray bark can provide a protective habitat for the monarch butterfly.

Syn. *Hesperocyparis macrocarpa*, *Neocupressus macrocarpa* and *Callitropsis macrocarpa*

*Cupressus macrocarpa* tolerates seaside conditions, sand and clay. *Cupressus macrocarpa* is great for a butterfly garden. *Cupressus macrocarpa*'s foliage color is green and type is evergreen. *Cupressus macrocarpa*'s flower color is na.





**Addendum to June 30, 2014, Adjustments to the Approved Point Pinos Lighthouse Landscape Plan (Date of Approved Plan, Draft 8, was June, 2010)**

Ken Hinshaw and Frances Grate met for over an hour on July 10, 2014, to discuss elements of the above referenced **Addendum**. Numbers discussed were #1, #5, #6.

**Note: Draft 8 is the approved plan**

#1. Modify the plan for a Monterey Cypress hedge. Plant Monterey Cypress about every 16 ' as needed inside the oval on the front (west) side. Actively nurture and shape these trees and maintain the height at 42". For the remaining area inside the oval, plant Monterey Cypress between the mature trees when possible or appropriate.

#5. Eliminate the proposed path completely. Since our goal is to route visitors to the gift shop for ticket purchase, install a blocking double gate across the oval drive west of the new ADA path.

#6. Ken and Frances agree on the following statement: Plant the 30'x24' area without any fence and define it with wood. Reconsider the wood fence at a later date.
